REPORT

A group of 19 students from 2nd year B.Sc. Computer Science of St. Anthony's College conducted a Basic IT Class from 08.06.2015 to 08.07.2015 as a part of Cyber Club program. The IT class was divided into two groups- morning 7.00 am to 8.00 am and evening 4.15 pm to 6.00 pm. The classes were held five days a week, from Monday to Friday. Students from different Departments- (Economics, Education, English, History, Khasi, Philosophy, Political Science, Botany, Fishery Science, Geology, Physics, and Commerce) of St. Anthony's College, both from 2nd year and 3rd year took an active participation in the program. The morning batch was having 22 students whereas the evening batch had 26- making a total of **48** students.

The one month IT Class was having a content of basic IT modules-

- Introduction to IT
- MS Word
- MS PowerPoint
- MS Excel
- Basic Internet

Three class tests of MS Word, MS PowerPoint and MS Excel for the assessment of the students were also taken on 22.06.2015, 29.06,2015 and 08.07.2015 respectively.

Attendance of the students was also taken compulsively. 16 students had a 100% of attendance in the one-month long course.

The certificates of the course were distributed on 15.07.2015 with the Hon'ble presence of Br. Albert L. Dkhar (Principal), Fr. Joby Joseph (Vice-Principal, HOD Computer Sc. Dept.) and also Digvijay Thapa (President, Cyber Club) at the Conference Hall.
