

Looking back to his academic progress, Dr Bhuyan did his degree in Zoology from this very college and his Masters in the same subject from NEHU. Professor (Dr.) Konjengbam Kamaljit Singh was born into the humble family of Mr (L)Kulajit Singh and Mrs. Kamala Devi on the 16th February 1960 in Shillong. He has one brother and three sisters. Dr. Singh had his entire education in Shillong and an excellent academic career throughout. St. Mary's School was the first cradle of learning for Dr Singh from where he jumped to St Anthony's High School and completed his HSLC from that school in 1979. He graduated from St. Anthony's College in 1981, securing the 13th rank in the Economics Honours merit list. He then went on to obtain his Masters Degree in 1983 from the North Eastern Hill University and repeated his brilliant performance by securing the 5th rank in the University. 

Time for change

An Overview of the Theme

The onset of COVID-19 has turned the entire world topsy-turvy and reconfigured the structures of many a thing that societies have come to depend on and take for granted too. The insidious and invisible virus has to a large extent brought the world to a standstill; even developed nations are seen trembling beneath the weight of indescribable losses of life and livelihood. To step into such areas of despondency and despair, teachers must be willing to evolve, to re-invent themselves and to be equipped with relevant knowledge, attitude and tools that will enable them to respond appropriately and adequately to the call for help, for meaning and for hope.

This two hour webinar, though brief, will attempt to plumb the depth of these and many other related issues and explore ways in which teachers can play crucial roles in - firstly, restoring a semblance of normalcy to the lives of their students; secondly, providing students with a sense of purpose and direction; and, thirdly, equipping them with skills, tools and knowledge to move ahead through the challenges that life will throw at them.



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

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Concept Note

Crises in life always compel us to find ways to adapt to survive. COVID-19, one such crisis, is now forcing teacher educators, teachers, parents, and students to adapt to having classes online. With educational institutions closed in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, online education and virtual schooling have been pushed to the forefront in the educational agenda. Millions of students being educated through Zoom, Google Classroom, Microsoft Teams, etc. are being touted as a significant tipping point in the evolution of educational technology use. After this, educators might need to seriously consider the prospect of online education taking on a more prominent role as school systems adjust to the post-pandemic world. What teachers, students and parents have been doing over the past few weeks amount most certainly to plenty of lessons that call for digital competencies. Teaching students coming from households with different backgrounds, circumstances and commitments, teachers transitioning to online classes have quickly learnt not to rely on "one-size-fits-all" assumptions about the type, timing, and mode of teaching. This raises the need for digitally-flexible approaches that reflect the many complex nature of students' learning environments. Timings need to be flexible and asynchronous; scheduling needs to be stretched; alternate options need to be available for working offline, and teaching needs to be designed to fit around the complex needs of different students.

Following from this need for pedagogic flexibility is the need for capacity building around digital improvisation. Again, the COVID-19 induced online education has underscored the fact that technology often fails, and that even the best-planned digital education platforms can fall short of expectations. This involves teachers having several to resort to several alternatives as well as to explore ways of entrusting students and parents with the responsibility to come up with arrangements for themselves whether on an individual "do it yourself" or more collective "do it ourselves" basis.

The most overwhelming element teaching during the COVID-19 lockdown has been its emotional and fragile nature. This raises the need for teachers to display high levels of digital empathy, care, and compassion towards their students. The lockdown is a period of frayed nerves and delicate sensitivity, especially for students. Understandably unsettled by their education being rudely interrupted, their parents' job prospects under threat and families facing the prospect of serious illness students are having a hard time coming to terms with what they are having to go through. Considering such developments, teachers are finding themselves having to deliver their online lessons with greater sensitivity and tact.

Contrary to what has been touted as the limitless possibilities of digital technologies, teachers and students and their parents are finding that remote online schooling is not as convenient and productive. Teachers, students, and parents have been to realise through their practical experiences that synchronous video classes and meetings require much more in preparation and planning. Digital technologies can easily exacerbate a collective descend into unhealthy patterns of overworking on a 24/7 basis. Hence, knowing what not to do with technology is a key digital competence.

In all these senses, COVID-19 has taught us all to value the social, emotional, and profoundly relational nature of online education, the digital teaching "competencies". Teaching of any sort is never simply a technical process. As such, this is a good time to begin reflecting on the various aspects of "digital competence" that have come to the fore today and who they relate to remote teaching and learning. The objective, of the six-day online national workshop, is, therefore, to provide teacher educators, teachers, and parents of school students with a platform that will equip them with the necessary tools to utilise synchronous and asynchronous e-learning platforms.
